# 'Power a Pensioner'

People Who Care's 'Power a Pensioner' program has been in full swing since October 2011, with over 300 food hampers being delivered over the Christmas period. A big thank you to all the volunteers involved.

The 'Power a Pensioner' program is about giving a hand to pensioners who rely solely on the government pension and are living in extreme poverty, some surviving on as little as \$40 per fortnight for food.

Groups such as Dine For Life with proceeds from a fundraising dinner and Peter Silvestri and his team at The Good Guys Midland store Local Giving Program helped make this possible.

As the General Manager I am thankful that People Who Care receives support from local retailers which then enable People Who Care to support local pensioners who are doing it tough. We hope to raise further awareness of this cause and continue to help people in need, in our community.

# Additional Funding for HACC Services in Western Australia

More frail, older people and younger people with a disability will receive support to stay in their own homes and communities, thanks to \$15.9 million in funding for the Home and Community Care (HACC) program this year.

Under HACC, 68,000 West Australians each year receive domestic help, nursing, allied health care such as physiotherapy and podiatry, home-delivered meals, social support and personal care.


People Who Care received a small increase in funding to provide additional transport in the Mandurah region and Social Support in the North and East Metropolitan regions.
