Recently one of our staff members became concerned when a client did not come to the door when knocked on. The staff member checked the property and found a newspaper on the front lawn, mail in the mail box and noticed that the TV was on in the lounge room. After trying to contact the clients family, the staff member then called the police for a welfare check. On police attending the home, the client was found lying on the ground with

injuries that required hospitalisation. In this instance our staff member followed the right procedure and possibly saved a life. We are very grateful for this.

HOW TO SPOT A PWC VEHICLE



In a suburb near you a People Who Care car, van or bus, may appear. These vehicles can be identified by the People Who Care logo and green colouring.

Keep it Clean Naturally and it's Cheap!

In the past many household cleaning products were made at home using whatever natural ingredients were readily available. Today, with the focus on sustainable living, these effective and easy to make cleaning solutions have found a place in the family home once again. Not only are these cleaning products environmentally friendly, but many of the ingredients needed may already be in your kitchen cupboard. Here are two ideas to help you get back to the basics.



1. Bicarbonate of soda is an inexpensive general purpose cleaner that can be used for many simple household chores. Simply place on a sponge and mix with warm water.

2. An environmentally friendly liquid furniture polish, which will keep all timber surfaces shiny and clean, can be made by dissolving one teaspoon of lemon oil in 600ml of olive oil. Apply with a clean, soft cloth. This liquid polish is especially good for allergy or asthma sufferers, as it picks up the dust instead of flicking it into the air.
